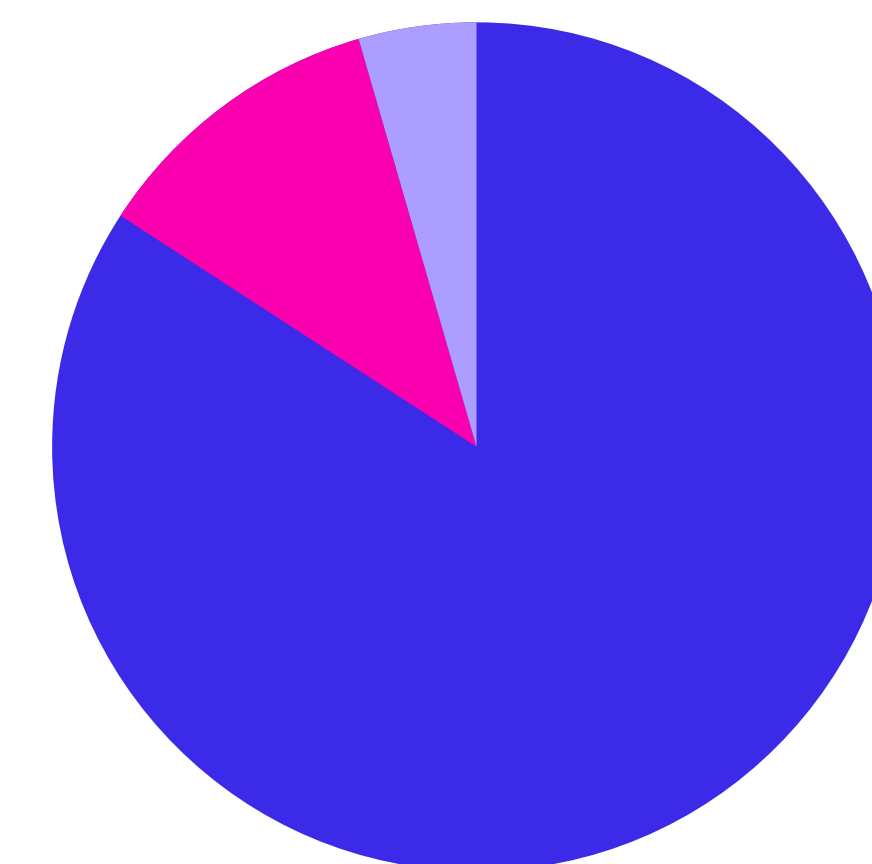

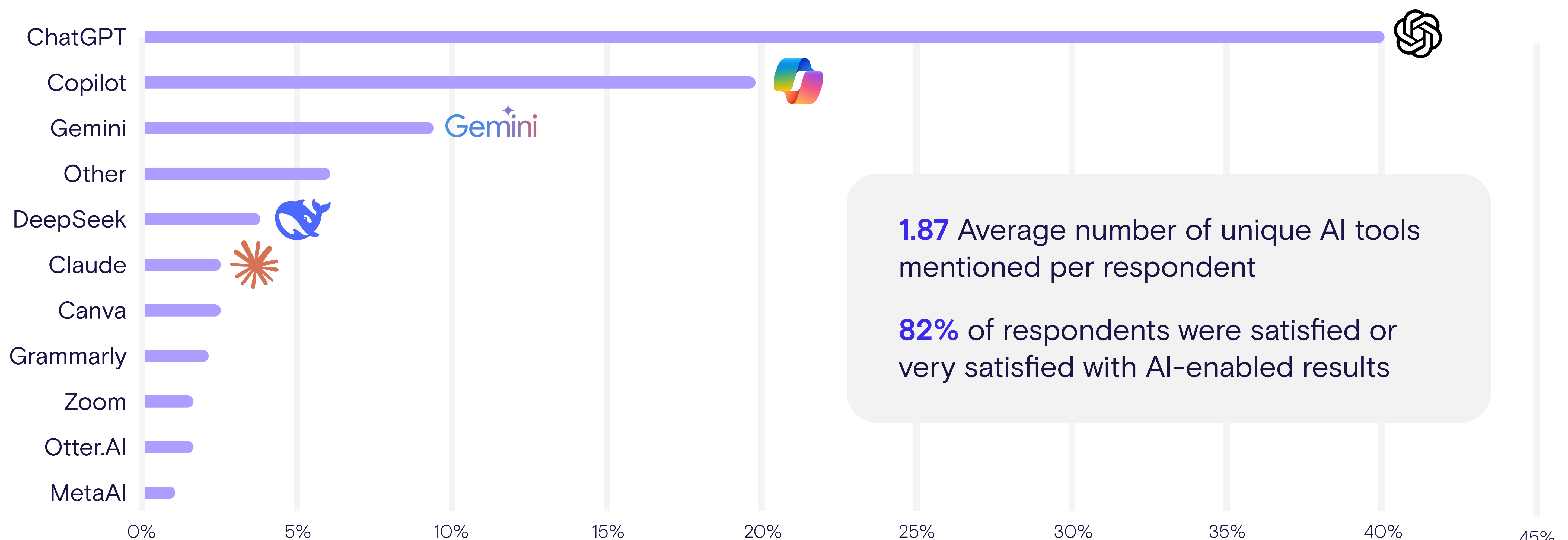
As part of your NPO work, have you used AI technology in the last 6 months?

73% of people who haven't used AI in the past 6 months plan to use it in the next 6 months.

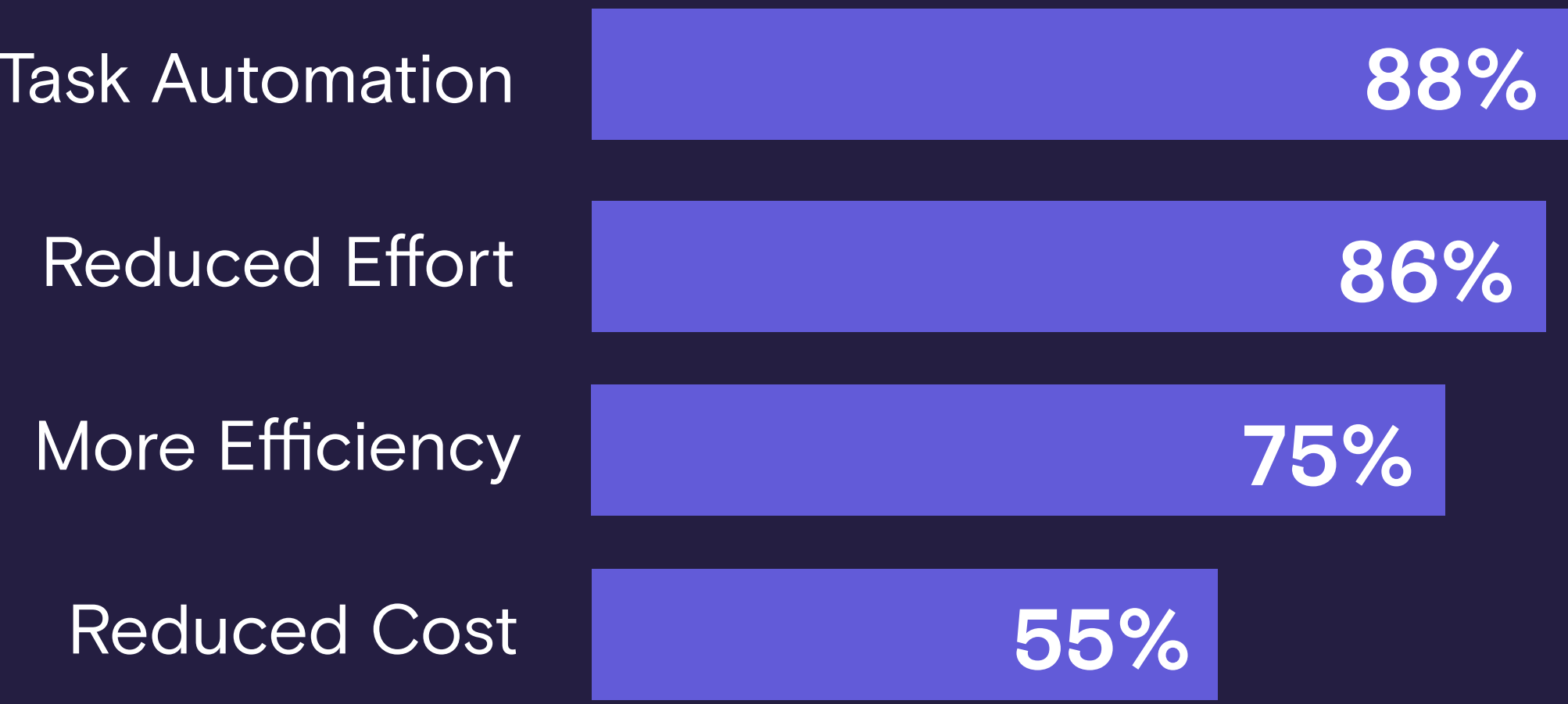
## What AI tools or capabilities have you used?



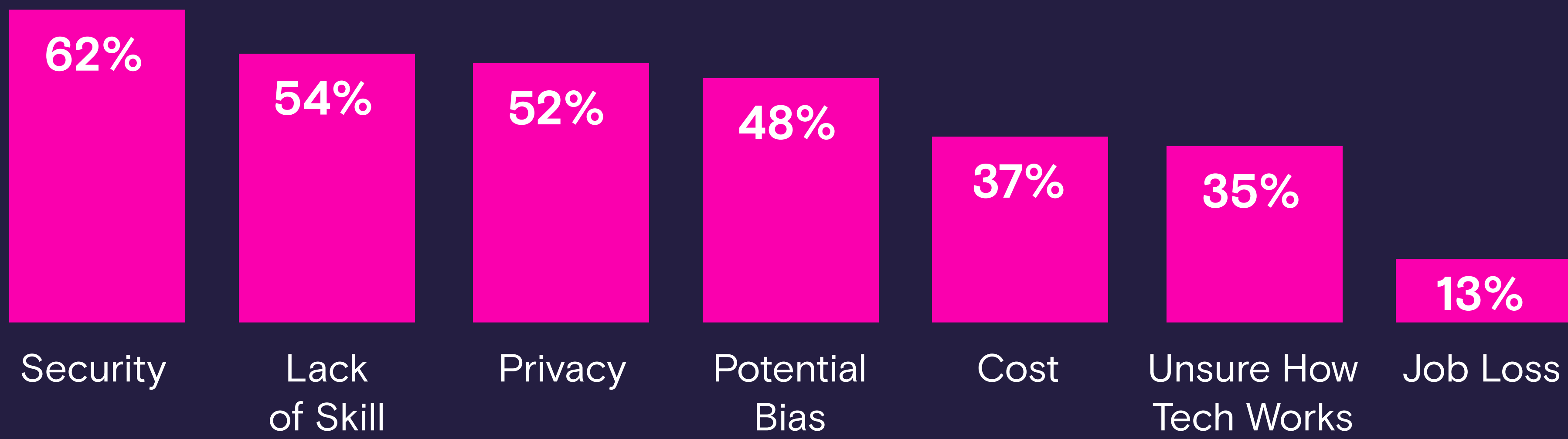

## Top Benefits Associated with Using AI

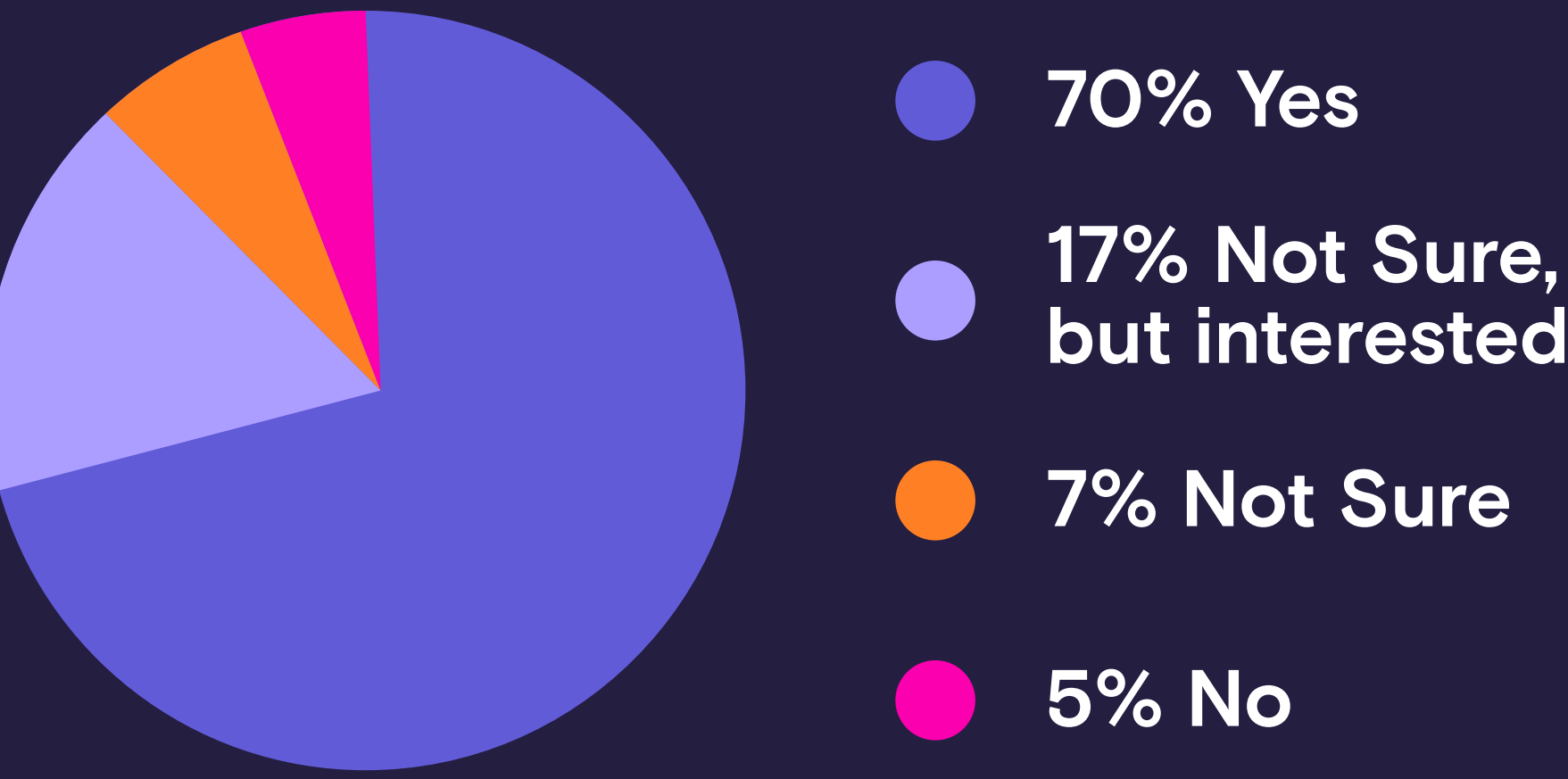

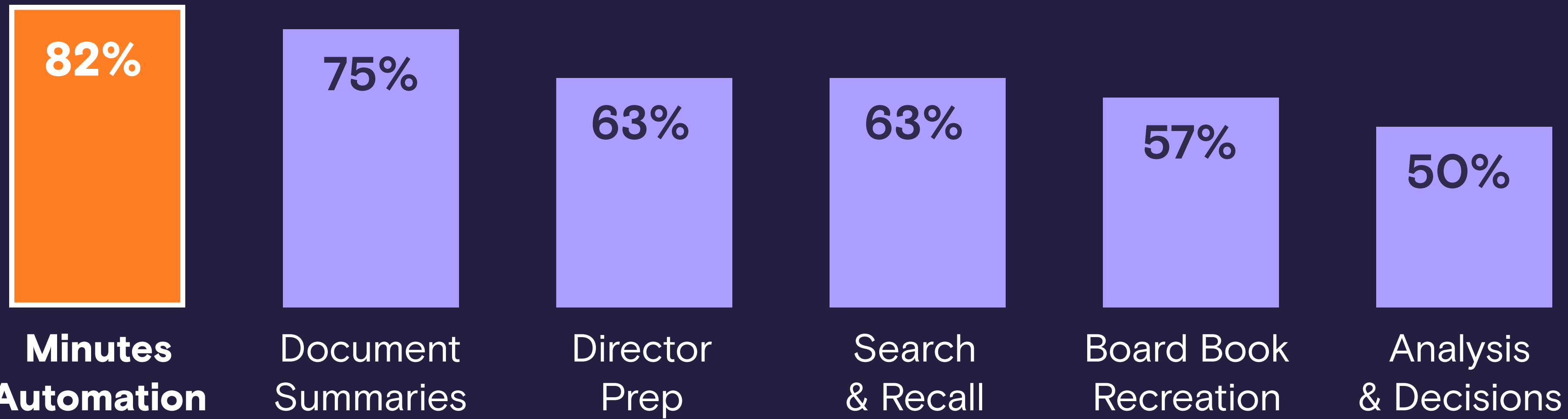

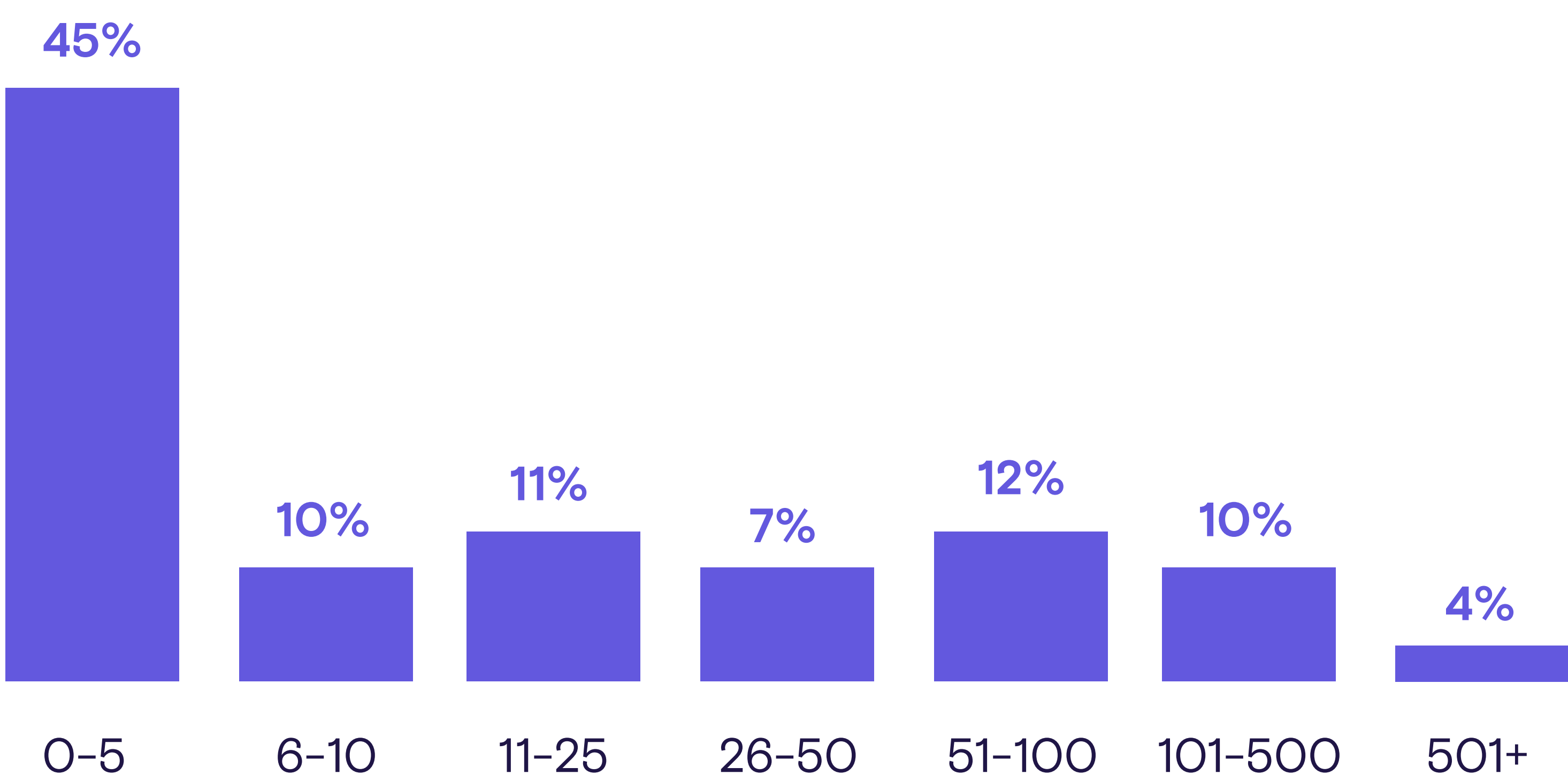

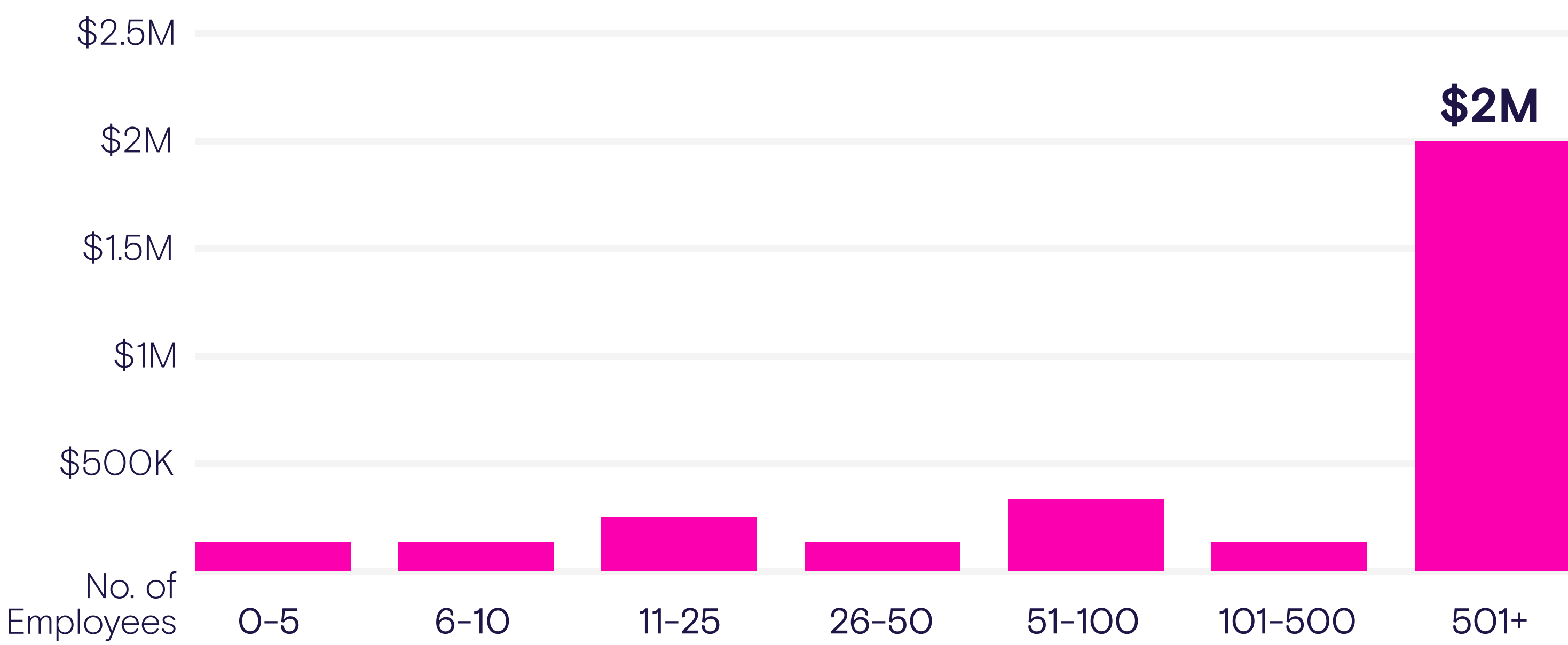

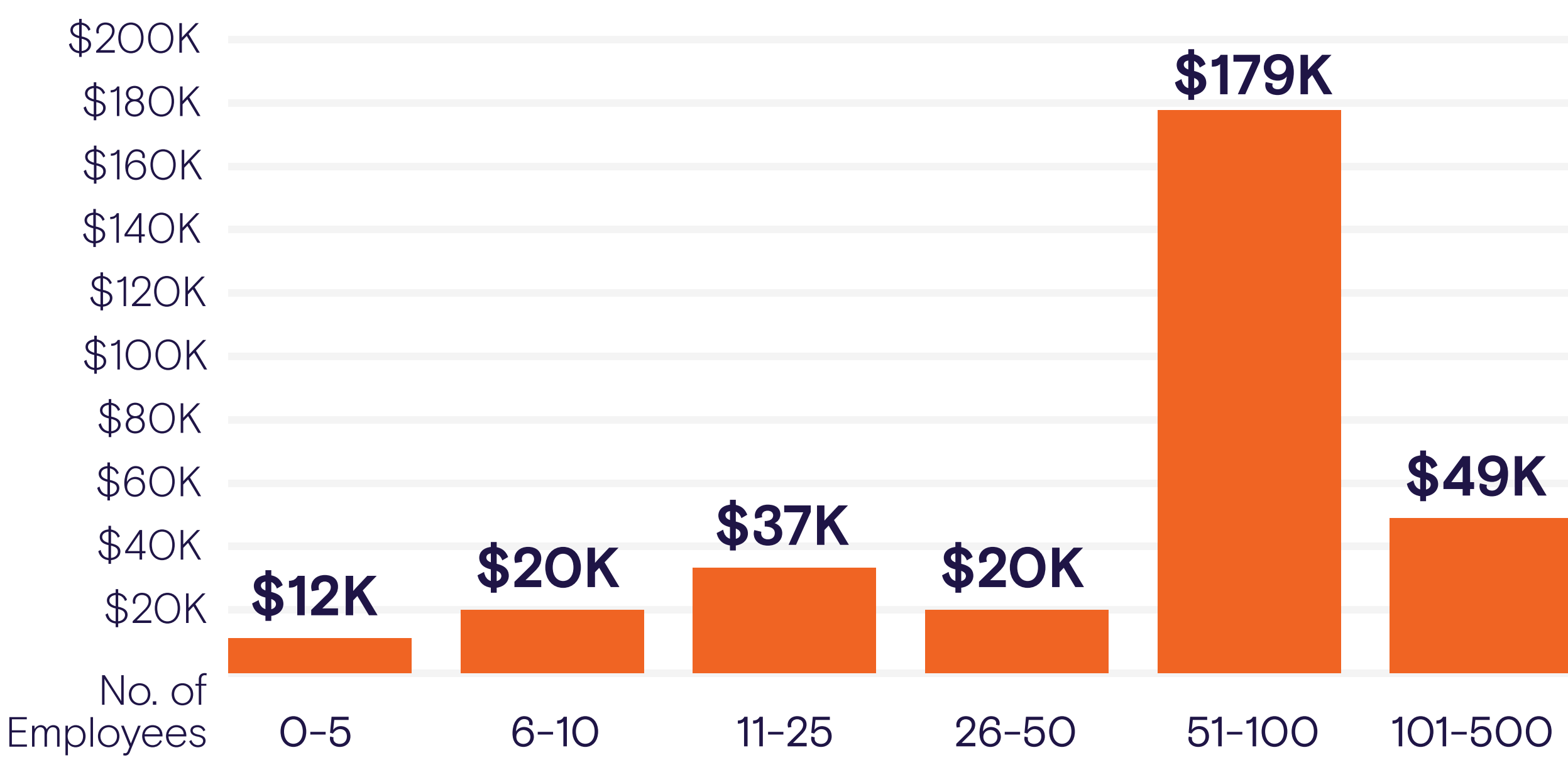
## Org Size by Total Employees
