


# Al in Nonprofit Boardroom



### Technology & Current Al Use






# As part of your NPO work, have you used Al technology in the last 6 months?



73% of people who haven't used Al in the past 6 months plan to use it in the next 6 months.


### What Al tools or capabilities have you used?








### **Org Size by Total Employees**
